ENTRY INFORMATION:

- B. Exhibitors must bring pigeons on Saturday, Sept. 1 by 10:00 a.m. Judging will be at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, September 3. Judging for the Juniors will be first with the Senior's to follow. Junior division will compete against all other Juniors. Pigeons will be released at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 8.
- C. Only those breeds, varieties and colors recognized by the NATIONAL PIGEON ASSOCIATION BOOK OF STANDARDS will be shown.
- Entry forms must include the following information: class, breed, variety and color, and band number.

JUDGING: The right is reserved for the judge to disqualify all unworthy entries. Each entry must be the property of the exhibitor and must be shown in its natural condition. The judge's decision is final.

In the Junior Division, the bird must by raised by the Junior exhibitor.

HEALTH REGULATIONS: An exhibitor shall not enter birds exposed to or affected with any contagious disease. All birds must be free of all parasites. No sick birds will be admitted. The superintendent or his assistant shall be the judge on what constitutes a sick bird. NOTE: All sick birds must be immediately removed from the barn.

BANDS: All birds should wear official seamless bands of the proper size issued by any club or organization. All birds entered with split, oversized or missing bands will be judged as old birds. NOTE: If you need help finding bands, please contact the superintendent.
