Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor to be awarded on all divisions with the exception that NOP & NOA are to be excluded when figuring these awards. Full registered name of animal to be listed on entry form or animal/breeder will not be included when figuring for these awards.

Overall Premier Exhibitor Award

To be awarded to the exhibitor winning the most money. No limit on number exhibited but award automatically figured on top eight animals winning the most money. All animals on one farm shall be considered one exhibit unless they are separately owned and separately operated. All classes included.

Overall Premier Breeder Award

Premier Breeder Award to be awarded to the breeder winning the most money in the open single classes, including animals bred by him but exhibited by others. Premier Breeder is defined as the name appearing as breeder on the registration certificate. No limit on the number exhibited but award automatically figured on top 8 animals winning the most money. All animals on one farm shall be considered one exhibit unless they are separately owned and separately operated. Premier Breeder Award will be awarded to exhibitor on the grounds.

Class: 25 • Premiums paid on top 6 overall animals only. Rules:

- 1. Entry Fee: \$3.00 per class. (\$6.00 if late entry accepted.)
- Animals competing in milking competition must be checked in by 12 pm on Monday, Sept 3rd, 2012 in order to compete.
- 3. This show is sanctioned by ADGA and their rules shall govern.
- Goats must be entered in their appropriate breeding class & division. Exhibitors will provide their own milking equipment.
- 5. The owner will certify in writing to the Superintendent & to ADGA that the goat has not received milk, thyroprotein, or any tonic or condition powder which states on the label it will increase milk production within 10 days of the test. This certificate shall be completed & signed by the owner in the presence of the Superintendent on the day of the milk-out.
- Goats shall be milked dry and stripped dry in the show ring under supervision of the official tester 24 hours before the hour set for the final milking. Milk out (first milking) will take place at 7pm on Monday, Sept. 3rd, in the dairy goat show ring.
- There will be 3 milkings, with the 2nd milking taking place at 7 a.m., Tuesday, Sept. 4th and the final milking will take place at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 4th.
- 8. Points will be awarded as follows;
 - a. For each pound milk, one point figured to one decimal.
 - b. For each complete ten days the goat has been in milk since last kidding, one tenth (.1) of a point, with a maximum of 3.6 points.
 - c. For each .05 pounds of butterfat yielded in the milkings one point.
 - Information will be sent to ADGA for any animal earning 18 or more points for a Star Milker designation.

SPECIAL BARN PRIZE

A \$15 barn prize is offered by Eastern Idaho State Fair for the best kept and decorated pen, and the best clean aisle in the Dairy Goat Barn.

ENTRIES: Close August 17.

FEE:

An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged for all classes All substitute exhibits must be entered at the livestock office no later than 6:00 p.m., Thursday, August 31. PASSES:

Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 4 animals entered. Tickets are non-transferable.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A. This is an ABGA sanctioned show. ABGA rules will govern.
- B. All boer goats to be shown must be registered in an association recognized by the ABGA. All boer goats entered or stalled in the barn must be shown. Entry forms must list name and registration numbers of animal entered. A copy of the registration papers must accompany the entry form.
- C. All boer goats must enter between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on Wednesday, September 7, and will be released at 8:00 p.m. Saturday, September 8.
- D. The base date for computing age of the animal shall be September 6.
- E. Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.
- F. Pens must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the superintendent may direct.
- G. Trucks and trailers cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock exhibit building, but must be parked in space designated by the superintendent. All cars, trucks and trailers must be out of the barn area by 10:00 a.m. each day of the fair.

DIVISIONS II, III, VI, VII and IX - Animals must be on grounds by 10:00 a.m. Saturday. RELEASE DATE: Will be released after 8:00 p.m. Tuesday.

DIVISION I, IV, V and VIII - Animals can arrive Tuesday night at 8:00 p.m.,

and must be stalled Wednesday by 12:00 Noon. Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning their own stalls.

2ND HALF RELEASED after 8:00 p.m. Saturday 9/8.

ENTRIES: Close August 17

FEES:

A. A nonrefundable entry fee of \$10.00 per class will be charged, including nurse cows. REMITTANCE FOR EXHIBITOR'S TICKET AND ENTRY FEES MUST ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY. AN ADDITIONAL LATE FEE OF \$10.00 WILL BE CHARGED AFTER AUGUST 20 AT SUPERINTENDENTS DISCRETION. All substitute exhibits must be entered at the Livestock Office by 12:01 p.m. Saturday in order to show. PASSES:

- A. Each exhibitor may purchase one exhibitor's ticket for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week.
- Caretakers may also purchase exhibitor's tickets, but no more than one B. ticket will be allowed for each three animals entered.

ENTRY FORMS:

- A. Entry forms must list name and registration numbers of animals entered and name and registration numbers of sire and dam. All exhibitors and their helpers are required to produce the registration certificates for each animal if requested.
- Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no B. exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class. SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- Pens must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of A. as the Superintendent may direct.
- Β. Trucks and trailers cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock exhibit buildings, but must be parked in space designated by the Superintendent. All cars, truck and trailers must be out of the barn area by 10:00 a.m. each day of the fair.
- C. All breeds will be shown according to that breed's rules as long as the 2 exhibitors and 20 animal quota is met.
- D. All males in the department, calves excepted, must have rings in noses. Aged bulls must have an extra neck rope.
- E. Any breed having less than 20 head exhibited for two consecutive years will be required to show in the "all other breed" division after that, and their division will be dropped from the premium book.

- F. The general rules as stated in the front of this book are applicable to this department
- G. Calves are not to leave the premises to nurse.
- H. Night watchman must have their area cleared by 6:30 a.m.
- Cooking or sleeping in barns is not permitted; also parking or camping is 1. not permitted in the infield.
- J. Copy of current Health Certificate must be provided to Livestock Office on entry to the fairgrounds.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS - All cattle over six months of age except steers offered for exhibition purposes at the Eastern Idaho State Fair shall have passed an official negative agglutination blood test for Brucellosis within 60 days of the date of entry. Blood samples, tests and reports must only be done by personnel authorized by the Idaho Department of Agriculture. Private blood tests run by local practitioners approved by the Federal or State Department of Agriculture will be accepted. Test charts must accompany the animals. Out-of-State cattle must meet Idaho Interstate Shipment Regulations. All cattle subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

Exceptions:

- (a) Cattle originating from Certified Brucellosis-Free herds are exempt from the Brucellosis test requirements. Owner must present herd certification papers on entry into the Fair.
- (b) Officially calf hood vaccinated females and non-vaccinated bulls originating from either Modified-Certified Brucellosis Free County or Certified Brucellosis Free County are exempt from the Brucellosis test requirements.

Animals will not be allowed to tie out until after 8:00 p.m.

NOTE: The use of straw is prohibited in the beef barns. Bedding in the form of wood shavings will be in place for the 1st half cattle. One bag of wood shavings per 2 animals will be provided for incoming cattle for the 2nd half. Straw will be provided, one bale for each two animals for tie-outs at the beginning of each half of the Fair. Any additional may be purchased at the Livestock office. Only one grooming chute per exhibitor is allowed in the barn.
