DIVISION I - Holsteins must be on the grounds by 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday and will be released after 8:00 p.m. on Saturday.

ENTRIES: Close August 17.

FEE:

- A. \$10.00 per head per class
- B. \$10.00 per group classes will be charged.
- C. NO ENTRIES WILL BE TAKEN AFTER AUGUST 30 UNLESS APPROVED BY SUPERINTENDENT.

PASSES:

- A. Livestock Exhibitor Ticket full week \$20.00. Livestock Exhibitor Ticket half week \$10.00. Exhibitor may purchase one ticket. Tickets are not transferable.
- B. Grooms or persons actually in charge of livestock entered may also purchase exhibitor's tickets, but no more than 1 ticket will be allowed for each (3) animals entered.
- C. Payment for exhibitor tickets must accompany entry.

ENTRY FORMS:

- A. All animals must have registration papers. Entry forms must list name and registration numbers of animals entered and name and registration numbers of sire and dam.
- B. All exhibitors and their helpers are required to carry the registration certificates for each animal in the show arena.
- C. Entries are limited to 20 animals per registered owner; an exhibitor will not be allowed more than two premiums in any one class. All group classes must be entered on entry forms prior to show or premiums will not be paid.
- D. If not listed on entry forms, animals cannot show in-group classes.
- E. All entries must be exhibited under the ownership of the person, partnership or company whose name appears on the registration papers.
- F. In case a herd is registered or bred in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm or breeding establishment, and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for all group classes. However, members of one family, where cattle are not housed as one unit, will not be considered as a single exhibitor.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A. Registration papers will be checked before judging begins. Signed transfer application will be accepted as evidence of ownership only when accompanied by signed check from seller for the transfer fee.
- B. The owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family, and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder if they carry the same prefix.
- C. All males in this department, calves excepted, must have rings in noses. Exhibitors are encouraged to have animals clipped prior to bringing to Fairgrounds.
- D. Any breed having less than 25 head entered for two consecutive years may be dropped from the premium book.
- E. If there is only one exhibitor per breed they will show in the all other breed category regardless of the number of animals.

- F. The general rules as stated in the front of this book are applicable to this department.
- G. Copy of current Health Certificate must be provided to Livestock Office on entry to the fairgrounds.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- A. All cattle must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Instate cattle must have a veterinary certificate of general soundness and good health.
- B. All female cattle four (4) months of age or older should have a legible Brucellosis vaccination tattoo. Tattoo should be verified by veterinarian on Health Certificate. Non-vaccinated females over twelve (12) months of age must have a negative Brucellosis test within thirty (30) days of entry into the Fair and may be entered for Show purposes only.
- C. All cattle for breeding or for sale purposes at the Fair must meet the Idaho change-of-ownership requirements.
- D. Out-of-state cattle must meet Idaho import requirements. Certificates of Veterinary inspections should be dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the EISF.
- E. All cattle are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds. Out-of-State cattle must meet Idaho Interstate shipment regulations
- F. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other appearance change for cosmetic purposes, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Silicon injection or other injections for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited.

All cattle subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

NEW RULES FOR CONTAMINATED MILK & DISPOSAL

A dairy parlor will be in operation during the Eastern Idaho State Fair. In order to market milk, exhibitors must use the milking facility and adhere to the milking rules set up by the Dairy Cattle Superintendent and Board of Directors.

Costs of milk testing will be paid by the exhibitor. Sampling of every cow milked at the parlor will be done at each milking. When milking is finished a tank sample will be tested for antibiotics. If tank sample is positive, then each farm will be tested individually from the samples collected for antibiotic contamination. Exhibitor(s) found to be positive will pay assessment for contaminated load of milk along with having their premiums withheld and all subsequent milk from those exhibitors' cattle will need to be dumped. Assessment for contaminated milk will also include, but not be restricted to, cost of disposing of milk by trucking company at site off grounds and all other expenses incurred.

To ensure and promoted that a safe and healthy product is in each tank of milk, these rules and explanations have been adopted by the Eastern Idaho State Fair Board of Directors and the Dairy Superintendent.

- A. All exhibitors must sign in when using the milking facility
- B. Any milk that is not acceptable for re-sale must be disposed of at the cost of the exhibitor. Contaminated milk cannot be dumped down drains in the barn or anywhere on grounds. Milk must be disposed of off grounds at exhibitor's expense. If an exhibitor is caught dumping down barn drains, all fines that the fair incurs will be paid by exhibitor. This will be monitored carefully by the Dairy Superintendent. Fluid milk is not acceptable from cows that are:
 - 1. Producing colostrums milk
 - 2. Producing mastitis milk
 - 3. Producing flaky milk
 - 4. Being treated with antibiotics
- C. All medical sharps or medical waste products must be disposed of properly. Medical waste receptacles are available near the milk parlor and livestock office. DO NOT, under any circumstances, throw sharps in the trash cans, feed bags or bedding. Any exhibitor failing to follow this procedure will automatically forfeit all prize money. There will be zero tolerance for such offense.

EXCEPTIONS

- A. Cattle originating from Certified Brucellosis-Free herds are exempt from the Brucellosis test requirements. Owner must present herd certificate papers on entry into the Fair.
- B. Officially calf hood vaccinated females and non-vaccinated bulls originating from either a Modified-Certified Brucellosis-Free County or Certified Brucellosis - Free County are exempt from the Brucellosis test requirements.

DIVISION I - HOLSTEINS – IDAHO STATE HOLSTEIN SHOW**Males:**

- Bull Calf - Born after Aug. 31, 2011 and over 4 months of age
- Yearling Bull - Born after Aug. 31, 2010 and prior to Sept. 1, 2011
- Grand Champion Bull - Purple Ribbon and Special Award
Reserve Grand Champion Bull - Lavender Ribbon

Females:

- Spring Heifer Calf - born after February 28, 2012, over 4 months of age
- Winter Heifer Calf - born after Nov. 30, 2011 and prior to March 1, 2012
- Fall Heifer Calf - born after Aug. 31, 2010 and prior to Dec. 1, 2011
- Summer Yearling Heifer - born after May 31, 2010 and prior to Sept. 1, 2011
- Spring Yearling Heifer - born after Feb. 28, 2011 and prior to June 1, 2011
- Winter Yearling Heifer - born after Nov. 30, 2010 and prior to March 1, 2011
- Fall Yearling Heifer - born after Aug. 31, 2010 and prior to Dec. 1, 2010
- Junior Champion Female - Purple Ribbon
Reserve Junior Champion Female - Lavender Ribbon
- Junior Grand Champion Heifer-bred & owned by exhibitor - \$50 and Rosette
- Best 3 junior females - to consist of 3 junior females from heifer classes, all to have been bred, and at least 2 to be owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

DRY COWS MUST HAVE FRESHENED WITHIN PAST 18 MONTH

- Dry cow, 3 - 4 years old
- Dry cow, 5 years old and older
- Junior cow, 2 years old - born after Feb. 28 and prior to Sept. 1, 2010 Any senior yearling in milk shall show in Junior 2 year old class.
- Senior cow, 2 years old - born after Aug. 31, 2009 and prior to March 1, 2009
- Junior cow, 3 years old - born after Feb. 28, 2009 and prior to Sept. 1, 2009
- Senior cow, 3 years old – born after Aug. 31, 2008 and prior to Feb. 28, 2009
- Intermediate Champion - Rosette
- Cow, 4 years old - born after Aug. 31, 2007, and prior to Sept. 1, 2008
- Cow, 5 years old - born after Aug. 31, 2006, and prior to Sept. 1, 2007
- Cow, 6 years old & older - born prior to Sept. 1, 2006

- Cow, 125,000 lb., DHIA sheets must be present
- Senior Champion Female - Purple Ribbon
Reserve Senior Champion Female - Lavender Ribbon
- Grand Champion Female - Purple Ribbon and Trophy
Reserve Grand Champion Female - Lavender Ribbon
- Grand Champion Cow - bred & owned by exhibitor - \$100 - Rosette
- Best Udder Award - Rosette ONLY
- Best 3 females, any age, all bred and at least two owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.
- Dairy Herd Group - to consist of 4 cows that have freshened. All to be owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.
- Breeders Herd- 5 head – females. All must be owned and at least three must be bred by the exhibitor. To consist of two females over the age of 2 and two under the age of 2 and 1 any age.
- Produce of Dam - to consist of 2 animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one cow. Dam must be named. Each exhibitor limited to one entry from same dam. Exhibitor need not own animals.
- Dam and Progeny - to consist of 2 animals, a dam and offspring of any age. Dam must be named. Exhibitor need not own both animals
- PRODUCTION AWARD: \$10
Award for each milking cow class (classes 16 - 19 and 21 – 24). Based on ECM production using the last 305 days' lactation record or current lactation exceeding 180 days. Exhibitors must have DHI records at the show.
- GRAND PERFORMER: \$50
Award determined by placing in individual classes and production in classes.

DIVISION II - JERSEYS

Classes 1 - 34 inclusive - Classifications same as for Holsteins.

DIVISION III - BROWN SWISS

Classes 1 - 34 inclusive. Classifications same as for Holsteins.

DIVISION IV - ALL OTHER BREEDS

Classes 1-34 inclusive - Classifications same as for Holsteins.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR'S AWARD - BANNER

To be made to the exhibitor winning the most money (not to exceed eight animals owned and exhibited by him) in the open single class. No more than two bulls can be included in the eight. No limit on number exhibited but award automatically figured on top eight animals winning the most money. All animals on one farm shall be considered one exhibit unless they are separately owned and separately operated. In the event of a tie, the next highest placing animal will be used as a tiebreaker.

PREMIER BREEDER AWARD - BANNER

To be made to the breeder of not to exceed eight animals winning the most money in the open single classes, including animals bred by him but exhibited by others. No more than two bulls can be included in the eight. No limit on the number exhibited but award automatically figured on top eight animals winning the most money. All animals on one farm shall be considered one exhibit unless they are separately owned and separately operated. In the event of a tie, the next highest placing animal will be used as a tiebreaker.
