JUDGING SCHEDULE

Pee Wee Age 0-7

Junior Age 8-18

Senior Age 19 & above

Showmanship, Wednesday, 9:00 a.m.

Open Doe Show (Combined Jr./Sr. doe sanction)

Junior Doe Show - all breeds, Wednesday, classes 1-9 immediately following the Junior and Senior Showmanship

Senior Doe Show - all breeds, classes 10-24

Thursday, 9:00 a.m.

Order of Show - BREED ORDER -Subject to change (will be posted in barn area.)



This is an official A.D.G.A. sanctioned show and their rules shall govern. Junior Doe Show, Wednesday, classes 1-7 AND Senior Doe Show, Thursday, classes 8-13, and their rules shall apply. A.D.G.A. will sanction 6 purebred breed classes, All Other Purebreds and Recorded Grades only. Any breed that does not sanction will be placed in the AOP division. The breed must sanction for 2 consecutive years before being placed in their own division. Show order will be posted in Dairy Goat Barn & Show Arena.

1. Horned goats will not be shown.
2. All Dairy Goats over 6 months of age must have A.D.G.A. purebred, American or recorded grade registration certificates. All does under 6 months of age may be shown with official duplicate certificates.

ENTRIES: Close August 17

FEE:

- A. \$5.00 per head will be charged for individual classes
- B. \$5.00 per entry for group classes with a maximum of 4 animals per pen.
- C. Remittance for tickets must accompany the entry.

ENTRY FORMS:

- A. All substitute exhibits must be entered at the Livestock Office by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday in order to show. **Registration papers need to be checked by this time also.** Late entries will be at the discretion of the superintendent, and a \$10.00 late fee per animal will be charged. NO ENTRY REFUNDS.
- B. Entry forms must list name and registration numbers of animals entered and name and registration numbers of sire and dam. **All exhibitors and their helpers are required to carry the registration certificates for each animal into the show arena.**
- C. All entries must include full name, address and telephone number of exhibitor, as well as **full registered name of animal.**

PASSES:

- A. Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 4 animals entered. Tickets are non-transferable.

PENS:

Open Class Dairy Goats must be on the grounds (penned, watered and fed) by 12:01 p.m. Tuesday.

Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class. "Only goats officially entered with paid premiums will receive pen assignments." No "un-entered" goats will be allowed without Superintendent approval.

The only ribbons that may be displayed are those won at this year's Eastern Idaho State Fair.

Pens must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the superintendent may direct.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A. Trucks and trailers cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock exhibit buildings, but must be parked on space designated by the Superintendent. All cars, trucks and trailers must be out of the barn area by 10:00 a.m. each day of the fair.
- B. No open class livestock will be released before 8:00 p.m. on Saturday.
- C. All exhibitors are urged to become familiar with the general rules and regulations in the front of this premium book.

- D. Milk-out time will begin at 6:00 p.m. the day before judging.
- E. We would like to encourage all exhibitors to wear white while showing animals.
- F. Base date for age classes is the first date of show.
- G. All goats will be clinically inspected on entering fairgrounds.
- H. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in their regular individual age class.
- I. Individual classes including Champion Challenge will receive premiums. Excluded are classes 6, and 16.
- J. Out-of-state goats must have a health certificate. Copy of current Health Certificate must be provided to Livestock Office on entry to the fairgrounds.

SHOW ORDER SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Individual Classes:

1. Junior Kid, born after May 1, to show date 2012
2. Early Junior Kid, born April 2012
3. Senior Kid, born March 2012
4. Early Senior Kid, born Oct 2011-Feb 2012
5. Dry Yearling, 12 months and under 24 (never freshened)
6. Junior Champion - Purple Rosette
Reserve Junior Champion - Lavender Rosette
7. Junior Get of Sire - 3 does never to have freshened, produce of same sire, **sire must be named**, and exhibitor need not own all.
8. Jr. Produce of Dam (2 Jr. does produce of the same doe, **dam must be named.**)
9. Jr. Breeders Class (3 Jr. does bred and owned by exhibitor) Buck need not be owned.
10. Yearling Milkers
11. Two years and under three
12. Three years and under four
13. Four years and under five
14. Five years and under seven
15. Seven years and over
16. Senior Champion - Purple Rosette
Reserve Senior Champion - Lavender Rosette
17. Champion Challenge - Permanent champions plus
Grand Champion of the Day – Rosette

Proof of championship can be either the prefix CH, GCH, or SGCH as affixed by ADGA on the animal's registration/recording certificate, OR presentation of the notification letter, issued by ADGA, in conjunction with the original registration/recording certificate. The letter is valid for use until December 31 of the year of issuance, after which the certificate of registration/recording must be officially updated (if using for show purposes).

Group Classes:

18. Get of Sire, to consist of 3 does, one in milk, the get of one sire. The exhibitor need not own all. **Sire must be named.** Each exhibitor limited to one entry sired by the same buck.
19. Produce of dam, to consist of 2 does any age, 1 to be in milk, produce of the same doe, **dam must be named**, exhibitor need not own all.
20. Dam and daughter, 1 or more, exhibitors choice, **dam must be named.**
21. Three generation females, (or more, exhibitors choice) to consist of 3 does any age, must all be owned by exhibitor.
22. Breeders' Class, 3 does any age, bred and owned by exhibitor. Buck need not be owned.
23. Dairy Herd, to consist of 4 does in milk owned by the exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.
24. Best Udder of Breed.

Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor to be awarded on all divisions with the exception that NOP & NOA are to be excluded when figuring these awards.

Full registered name of animal to be listed on entry form or animal/breeder will not be included when figuring for these awards.

Overall Premier Exhibitor Award

To be awarded to the exhibitor winning the most money. No limit on number exhibited but award automatically figured on top eight animals winning the most money. All animals on one farm shall be considered one exhibit unless they are separately owned and separately operated. All classes included.

Overall Premier Breeder Award

Premier Breeder Award to be awarded to the breeder winning the most money in the open single classes, including animals bred by him but exhibited by others. Premier Breeder is defined as the name appearing as breeder on the registration certificate. No limit on the number exhibited but award automatically figured on top 8 animals winning the most money. All animals on one farm shall be considered one exhibit unless they are separately owned and separately operated. Premier Breeder Award will be awarded to exhibitor on the grounds.

Class: 25 • Premiums paid on top 6 overall animals only.**Rules:**

1. Entry Fee: \$3.00 per class. (\$6.00 if late entry accepted.)
2. Animals competing in milking competition must be checked in by 12 pm on Monday, Sept 3rd, 2012 in order to compete.
3. **This show is sanctioned by ADGA** and their rules shall govern.
4. Goats must be entered in their appropriate breeding class & division. Exhibitors will provide their own milking equipment.
5. The owner will certify in writing to the Superintendent & to ADGA that the goat has not received milk, thyroprotein, or any tonic or condition powder which states on the label it will increase milk production within 10 days of the test. This certificate shall be completed & signed by the owner in the presence of the Superintendent on the day of the milk-out.
6. Goats shall be milked dry and stripped dry in the show ring under supervision of the official tester 24 hours before the hour set for the final milking. Milk out (first milking) will take place at 7pm on Monday, Sept. 3rd, in the dairy goat show ring.
7. There will be 3 milkings, with the 2nd milking taking place at 7 a.m., Tuesday, Sept. 4th and the final milking will take place at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 4th.
8. Points will be awarded as follows;
 - a. For each pound milk, one point figured to one decimal.
 - b. For each complete ten days the goat has been in milk since last kidding, one tenth (.1) of a point, with a maximum of 3.6 points.
 - c. For each .05 pounds of butterfat yielded in the milkings one point.
 - d. Information will be sent to ADGA for any animal earning 18 or more points for a Star Milker designation.

SPECIAL BARN PRIZE

A \$15 barn prize is offered by Eastern Idaho State Fair for the best kept and decorated pen, and the best clean aisle in the Dairy Goat Barn.

JUDGING

Division I: Wednesday September 5, at 1:00 p.m. • Livestock Pavilion
Division II: Thursday, September 6, at 8:00 a.m. • Livestock Pavilion

ENTRIES: Close August 17.

FEE:

An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged for all classes All substitute exhibits must be entered at the livestock office no later than 6:00 p.m., Thursday, August 31. **PASSES:**

Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 4 animals entered. Tickets are non-transferable.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A. This is an ABGA sanctioned show. ABGA rules will govern.
- B. All boer goats to be shown must be registered in an association recognized by the ABGA. All boer goats entered or stalled in the barn must be shown. Entry forms must list name and registration numbers of animal entered. A copy of the registration papers must accompany the entry form.
- C. All boer goats must enter between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on Wednesday, September 7, and will be released at 8:00 p.m. Saturday, September 8.
- D. The base date for computing age of the animal shall be September 6.
- E. Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.
- F. Pens must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the superintendent may direct.
- G. Trucks and trailers cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock exhibit building, but must be parked in space designated by the superintendent. All cars, trucks and trailers must be out of the barn area by 10:00 a.m. each day of the fair.

HEALTH RULES:

- A. All out of state boer goats must have a health certificate and health permit number. All boer goats will be health inspected upon entry to the fair.
- B. All boer goat exhibitors must comply with all general rules and regulations of the Eastern Idaho State Fair as listed in the premium book.
