TONY GREGORY - SUPERINTENDENT**SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:**

- All entry fees must be paid before event. All entry money over stock charge will go toward prizes and purse money.
- Each County Fair that holds a team sorting, branding or penning event will be eligible to send one (1) team per event to the E.I.S.F. For Bonneville and Bannock Counties that have (2) county fairs, (2) qualifying teams will be allowed. All other slots will be filled by E.I.T.P.B.A.
- All counties that have qualifying teams must send names to Tony & Debbie Gregory (208) 852-3377 no later than August 19. Top qualifying teams from each qualified event are eligible to participate.
- Each qualifying event should submit the first four places.
- There shall be one (1) Idaho riders per team.
- Any person wishing to bid on supplying cattle must call Tony & Debbie Gregory before August 1st. Cattle must be fresh and have not been used in any other event in the last 60 days. Contractor will be responsible for any injury to cattle.
- No team can represent the same qualifying event more than once.
- Any contestant verbally harassing any official or volunteer appointed by the Superintendent will be banned from future shows. (To file a protest a deposit of \$100 will be required. See EITPBA rules #19)
- Only trucks and trailers with horses are allowed to park on the infield for these events. Cars will be not be permitted to park on the infield.

IDAHO STATE TEAM SORTING FINALS

- Entry fee of \$60 per person
- There will be \$500 added to the total purse by EISF.
- Each team will consist of 3 riders.
- Only those teams having won an approved county team sorting event are eligible to enter the finals at the Eastern Idaho State Fair.
- The event will consist of 12 head of cattle; 10 will be numbered, 2 will be left blank.
- An individual may compete twice at the finals.
- The overall winners will be placed on both go-rounds on total number of cattle across line plus total time.
- There will be two 90 second go-rounds.
- There will be a fast time on each go. The winner will receive \$90 for their team.
- This event will be held under EITPBA rules.

IDAHO STATE TEAM PENNING FINALS

- Entry fee of \$60 per person.
- \$500 will be added to the total purse by EISF.
- There will be two 90 second go-rounds.
- There will be a fast time on each go. The winner will receive \$100 \$90 for their team.
- EITPBA rules apply to this event.
- An individual may compete twice. Overall winners will be placed on both go-rounds with total number of cattle penned, plus time.

IDAHO STATE TEAM BRANDING FINALS

- Entry fee of \$60 per person.
- \$500 will be added to the total purse by EISF.
- Teams consist of four riders/four head of cattle, with an 8-minute time limit.
- An individual may compete twice at this event.
- This event will be held under the EITPBA rules.

IDAHO STATE PRO AM TEAM BRANDING

- Entry fee is \$45 per person.
- Teams must consist of four riders. Two riders must be pros and two riders must be either two women or two children age 14 and under or one of each.
- Women and children may enter twice, pros may enter once.
- There will be a 5-minute time limit, 2 head of cattle.
- Teams will be required to qualify from a county show as in the open.
- This event will be held under the EITPBA rules.

FEES: Remittance for entries and exhibitor tickets must accompany the entry.

An additional \$25 per horse will be charged for entries made after Aug. 17. No entries after 5:00 p.m. on the day before the class. No refunds allowed unless accompanied by a note from a veterinarian.

STALLS:

- A \$15.00 stall fee per horse will be charged. Stall requests will not be taken before August 1. Anyone wishing to stall throughout the week should make their request at that time and **MUST** stay through Saturday. No stalls will be provided unless an animal is entered and shown in a Light Horse/Horse Show class. Animals stalled must be shown. All stall requests should be sent to becys1trickpony@gmail.com.
- 4-H stalling is for Sept. 1 **ONLY**. Open class horses cannot come in until Sunday after 1:00 p.m. **PLEASE CHECK WITH LIVESTOCK OFFICE BEFORE PLACING HORSE IN STALLS.**

ENTRY FORMS:

- Horses to be entered under the **OWNER'S** name and should be the same name that appears on the horse's registration papers.
- Entry forms must be complete and legible copies of the horse's registration papers front and back must accompany the entry.
- You must also include a copy of the front and back of your current membership card. Group classes to be entered and shown under Sire or Dam's name and registration number respectively.
- All entry forms must be completed, signed, with attached copies of registration papers and membership cards and fees paid before 5:00 p.m. on the day prior to the show or entry will be scratched from the class. ("No class changes will be made after 5:00 pm the day prior to the show.")
- Ages must be computed from January 1st.
- Incomplete entry forms will not be entered. Any youth entries must include the youths name, address and birth date.

PASSES:

- Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 1 animal entered. Tickets are non-transferable.
- Payment for exhibitor tickets must accompany entry.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- PREMIUMS PAID TO OWNER OF ANIMAL EXCEPT IN THE CHILDREN'S PONY CLASS.**
- Each exhibitor is responsible for providing all necessary information for show reports to the Livestock Office before their class begins. Management will not be responsible for animals not reported due to lack of information.
- Exhibitor will inspect stall before stalling the horse. Report any stalling problem before stalling animal. Stalls must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the Superintendent may direct.

NOTE: The use of straw is prohibited in the Light Horse barn. Wood shavings will be provided for the first bedding.

Light Horse exhibitors stalling in barns should enter parking lot behind the barn to unload horses.

This show is sanctioned by FOSH. www.fosh.info. It is hosted by EISF and Eastern Idaho Gaited Horse Association – EIGHA. If you have questions, contact EIGHA show chairman, Jane Howlett, jhowlett@ida.net or www.eigha.org. Participants must pre-register with the EISF Livestock office according to their rules and regulations. Their phone number is 208-785-2480 ext 112 or 113, will be in the office after August 13.

It is recommended that juveniles 17 and under wear a safety helmet in all classes. Helmets are optional for adults in any and all classes. EIGHA has helmets available upon request, otherwise headgear should be appropriate to the attire.

FOSH rules will be observed for judging purposes. Some of the rules to observe are as follows. Prohibited items: training aids of any kind, such as but not limited to, tiedowns, running martingales, dropped cavesons, action devices such as chains or rollers, or shoes heavier than a traditional lite shoe (3/4 inch wide, 3/8 inch thick, 1 inch turnback). Horses' feet must be no longer than 4 1/2 inches. Determination of prohibited items is at the discretion of the judge and /or EIGHA show committee. For complete list of rules go to websites listed above.

Anyone riding any attire other than English must use a leverage (shank) bit and one hand on the reins. Horses 5 years and under in a snaffle bit may be ridden with two hands.

All western classes require western tack and clothing. English classes require English tack and clothing. Any tack and clothing is acceptable for open classes as long as the clothing and tack are consistent. AOT means a horse that is trained and owned by an amateur. There can be no professional involvement for the past six months.

No entry fee required for Championship classes. No premiums paid for Championship classes. To qualify for Championship classes, exhibitor must place first or second in the particular category. Championship classes will award prizes or trophies. Championship Class Sponsors will be announced at show and on www.eigha.org

American Horse Show Association Rules and Guidelines for open English classes. Hunt or Saddle seat styles except for designated Hunter classes. No more than 8 horses to hand gallop at once.

61. Bridle Path Hack – Walk, trot, canter, & hand gallop. Back readily. Stand for dismount & mount.
62. Road Hack – Walk, trot, road trot, canter, hand gallop, halt at any time & walk off on loose rein.
63. Open English Pleasure – Walk, trot, strong trot, canter & hand gallop maintaining contact.
64. Hunter Under Saddle – Walk, trot & canter. Hand gallop one direction of the arena.
65. English Equitation (all ages) – Walk, trot and canter on the rail as group. Judge may then request individual tests for any or all riders.

Then asked to line up and change into western tack. 5 minute allowance for tack change. 2 grooms may help with tack change. No attire change necessary for rider. Show in western tack at a walk, jog, and lope. To be judged 50% under hunter tack and 50% under western tack.
