ENTRIES: Close August 17

Late entries or early releases will be at the discretion of the superintendent.

FEE: \$1.00 per bird.

Poultry/Pigeons Will be available next to the Ticket Office on Park St.

- A. Monday Saturday, September 3-8, from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- B. Sunday, September 9 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- C. After September 9 awards will be given out only during regular office hours. Premiums not claimed by September 30 will be considered a donation and will revert back to the Fair's general fund.

RELEASE:

A. All poultry will be released at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 8.

JUDGING:

A. Judging will take place Monday at 10:00 a.m.

STALLS/PENS:

A. Pens to be assigned.

ENTRY INFORMATION:

- A. All birds will be judged by the APA and ABA Standards of Perfection.
- B. Birds shown by a junior must be identified. Any birds not noted will be judged with adult exhibitors. Include division, class, variety (color) and gender/sex (pullet, cockerel, hen, cock), with each and every bird.
- C. Include exhibitor's phone number on all entry forms. If this information is incomplete or inaccurate, the exhibitor will be called for the information. Please be thorough when completing the entry form.
- D. All birds shown must have numbered leg band, and entry form must include band number for each bird. Exhibitors must find their own bands. Check the internet at www.jeds.com or call 1-800-659-5928; you may also call Firth Mill (208) 346-6122.
- E. There will be a class for each breed entered.
- F. Birds over 1 year old will be classified as Cocks and Hens; birds under 1 year old as Cockerels and Pullets.
- G. Entries must state whether entries are large fowl, bantams, ducks, geese, or turkeys, whether non-bearded or bearded, and whether single or rose comb.
- H. Birds are entered at owner's risk. The Fair will not be responsible for the birds during the show. However, every precaution will be taken to insure their safety.
- Any bird showing evidence of disease will be placed in isolation and returned to its owner.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A. No one will be allowed to handle the birds except the judge, show committee, or its owner. All birds must be put into cages by owner for liability reasons.
- B. Signs placed in cages advertising animals for sale is prohibited. Business cards may be placed in or on the cages.
- C. Night watchmen must have their area cleared by 6:30 a.m.
- D. Parking and camping are not permitted in the infield.
- E. HEALTH RULES: Any bird showing signs of ill health will be removed from the show. Exhibitors are encouraged to dust poultry for lice and mites one week before the show. No bird may be entered that has leg mites, C.R.D., or any other health problem.

NOTE: Exhibitors are required to enter at the Northeast gate.

A. There will be no early release and late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Superintendent.

ENTRY INFORMATION:

- B. Exhibitors must bring pigeons on Saturday, Sept. 1 by 10:00 a.m. Judging will be at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, September 3. Judging for the Juniors will be first with the Senior's to follow. Junior division will compete against all other Juniors. Pigeons will be released at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 8.
- C. Only those breeds, varieties and colors recognized by the NATIONAL PIGEON ASSOCIATION BOOK OF STANDARDS will be shown.
- Entry forms must include the following information: class, breed, variety and color, and band number.

JUDGING: The right is reserved for the judge to disqualify all unworthy entries. Each entry must be the property of the exhibitor and must be shown in its natural condition. The judge's decision is final.

In the Junior Division, the bird must by raised by the Junior exhibitor.

HEALTH REGULATIONS: An exhibitor shall not enter birds exposed to or affected with any contagious disease. All birds must be free of all parasites. No sick birds will be admitted. The superintendent or his assistant shall be the judge on what constitutes a sick bird. NOTE: All sick birds must be immediately removed from the barn.

BANDS: All birds should wear official seamless bands of the proper size issued by any club or organization. All birds entered with split, oversized or missing bands will be judged as old birds. NOTE: If you need help finding bands, please contact the superintendent.
