ENTRIES - FEES - DATE: Entries close August 17.

- A charge of \$5.00 per head will be charged for individual classes and \$5.00 for group classes. Because of the large number of exhibits and shortage of space, all pens must be used for animals exhibited.
- Remittance for exhibitor's ticket and pen fees must accompany the entry.
- Livestock Exhibitor Ticket \$20.00; Half Week Livestock Exhibitor Tickets \$10.00 Exhibitor may purchase one ticket for personal use.
- Caretaker may also purchase one exhibitor ticket, but no more than one ticket will be allowed for each (3) three animals entered. Tickets are not transferable.

ENTRIES CLOSE:

- A. Entries will be closed when approximately 400 sheep have been entered. All substitute exhibits must be entered at the Livestock Office by 6:00 p.m. Saturday, 9/1, in order to show. Sheep must be on the grounds by 12:00 noon on Saturday, September1, unless prior arrangement are made with the Superintendent.
- Entry forms must list name and registration number of animals entered. A copy of the registration papers should accompany the entry form.
- Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no exhibitor will be allowed more than one premium in classes 5,10,14,17-20 and no more than two premiums in classes 1-4, 8 & 9, 11-13.

JUDGING:

Show order each day will be determined according to the number of entries received. Judging schedule will be posted by 8:00 a.m. Saturday, September 1. Judging will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, September 2 in the Livestock Pavilion and at 8:00 a.m. on Monday September 3, in the Livestock Pavilion.

PREMIUMS: Sheep checks will be available by Noon on Wednesday, September 5, 2012, at the Livestock Office.

RELEASE DATE:

Sheep will be released at 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday. All sheep must leave the building to facilitate cleaning.

GENERAL RULES FOR OTHER LIVESTOCK INFORMATION (front of book)

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A breed must have a minimum of 2 exhibitors and 15 head shown in the individual classes to have a show. If a breeds' numbers fall below these requirements, it will be automatically placed on a one-year probation. If a breed falls below the minimum requirements for two consecutive years, the show will be dropped.
- HEALTH RULE: All sheep must be inspected for any indications or symptoms of Blue Tongue, contagious Ecthyma/sore mouth, foot rot, sore sheath, or any other contagious or infectious diseases. Inspection will be made on Saturday at the fairgrounds. Animals exhibiting these symptoms will be asked to leave. All sheep must be identified with Federal Sheep Interstate Movement Identification. All sheep imported into Idaho must be accompanied by a current health certificate and permit number.
- Lambs that have been sold at County Fairs cannot be shown at the Eastern Idaho State Fair. Only sheep entered in the Open Show will be allowed in the barn.

- Classes that have a large number of entries will be shown in groups of 15.
- E. Sheep cannot enter show ring without being fit.
- F. The superintendent reserves the right to adjust entry for the benefit of classes and exhibitor.
- G. Sheep that are stalled during Open Class must be shown.
- H. Parking or camping in the infield is not permitted.
- Sleeping is not permitted in the barns.
