ENTRIES:

- Close August 16.
- All substitute exhibits must be entered at the livestock office no later than 6:00 p.m., Thursday, August 29.
- All boer goats must enter between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on Wednesday, September 4.

FEE:

An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged for all classes.

PASSES:

Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 4 animals entered. Tickets are non-transferable.

RELEASE DATE: Boer Goats will be released at 8:00 p.m. Saturday, September 7.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- This is an ABGA sanctioned show. ABGA rules will govern.
- All boer goats to be shown must be registered in an association recognized by the ABGA. All boer goats entered or stalled in the barn must be shown. Entry forms must list name and registration numbers of animal entered. A copy of the registration papers must accompany the entry form.
- The base date for computing age of the animal shall be September 5.
- Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.
- Pens must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the superintendent may direct.
- Trucks and trailers cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock exhibit building, but must be parked in space designated by the superintendent. All cars, trucks and trailers must be out of the barn area by 10:00 a.m. each day of the fair.

HEALTH RULES:

- All out of state boer goats must have a health certificate and health permit number. All boer goats will be health inspected upon entry to the fair.
- All boer goat exhibitors must comply with all general rules and regulations of the Eastern Idaho State Fair as listed in the exhibitor handbook.

DIVISIONS II, III, VI, VII and IX - Animals must be on grounds by 10:00 a.m. Saturday.

RELEASE DATE: Will be released after 8:00 p.m. Tuesday.

DIVISION I, IV, V and VIII - Animals can arrive Tuesday night at 8:00 p.m., and must be stalled Wednesday by 12:00 Noon. Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning their own stalls.

2ND HALF RELEASED after 8:00 p.m. Saturday 9/7.

ENTRIES: Close August 16

FEES:

- A nonrefundable entry fee of \$10.00 per class will be charged, including nurse cows. REMITTANCE FOR EXHIBITOR'S TICKET AND ENTRY FEES MUST ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY. AN ADDITIONAL LATE FEE OF \$10.00 WILL BE CHARGED AFTER AUGUST 20 AT SUPERINTENDENTS DISCRETION. All substitute exhibits must be entered at the Livestock Office by 12:01 p.m. Saturday in order to show.

PASSES:

- Each exhibitor may purchase one exhibitor's ticket for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week.
- Caretakers may also purchase exhibitor's tickets, but no more than one ticket will be allowed for each three animals entered.

ENTRY FORMS:

- Entry forms must list name and registration numbers of animals entered and name and registration numbers of sire and dam. All exhibitors and their helpers are required to produce the registration certificates for each animal if requested.
- Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- Pens must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the Superintendent may direct.
- Trucks and trailers cannot be parked in the vicinity of the livestock exhibit buildings, but must be parked in space designated by the Superintendent. All cars, truck and trailers must be out of the barn area by 10:00 a.m. each day of the fair.
- All breeds will be shown according to that breed's rules as long as the 2 exhibitors and 20 animal quota is met.
- All males in the department, calves excepted, must have rings in noses. Aged bulls must have an extra neck rope.
- Any breed having less than 20 head exhibited for two consecutive years will be required to show in the "all other breed" division after that, and their division will be dropped from the premium book.
