
TEAM PENNING, BRANDING & SORTING

Grandstand Arena - Tuesday, September 3 - 8:00 a.m.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A. All entry fees must be paid before event. All entry money over stock charge will go toward prizes and purse money.
- B. Each County Fair that holds a team sorting, branding or penning event will be eligible to send one (1) team per event to the E.I.S.F. For Bonneville and Bannock



- C. All counties that have qualifying teams must send names to Tony & Debbie Gregory (208) 852-3377 no later than August 16. Top qualifying teams from each qualified event are eligible to participate.
- D. Each qualifying event should submit the first ten places.
- E. There shall be one (1) Idaho riders per team.
- F. Any person wishing to bid on supplying cattle must call Tony & Debbie Gregory before August 1st. Cattle must be fresh and have not been used in any other event in the last 60 days. Contractor will be responsible for any injury to cattle.
- G. No team can represent the same qualifying event more than once.
- H. Any contestant verbally harassing any official or volunteer appointed by the Superintendent will be banned from future shows. (To file a protest a deposit of \$100 will be required. See EITPBA rules #19)
- Only trucks and trailers with horses are allowed to park on the infield for these events. Cars will be not be permitted to park on the infield.

IDAHO STATE TEAM SORTING FINALS

- 1. Entry fee of \$60 per person
- 2. There will be \$500 added to the total purse by EISF.
- 2. Each team will consist of 3 riders.
- Only those teams having won an approved county team sorting event are eligible to enter the finals at the Eastern Idaho State Fair.
- 4. The event will consist of 12 head of cattle; 10 will be numbered, 2 will be left
- 5. An individual may compete twice at the finals.
- The overall winners will be placed on both go-rounds on total number of cattle across line plus total time.
- 7. There will be two 90 second go-rounds.
- 8. There will be a fast time on each go. The winner will receive \$90 for their team.
- 9. This event will be held under EITPBA rules.

IDAHO STATE TEAM PENNING FINALS

- 1. Entry fee of \$60 per person.
- 2. \$500 will be added to the total purse by EISF.
- 3. There will be two 90 second go-rounds.
- There will be a fast time on each go. The winner will receive \$100 \$90 for their team.
- 5. EITPBA rules apply to this event.
- An individual may compete twice. Overall winners will be placed on both gorounds with total number of cattle penned, plus time.

IDAHO STATE TEAM BRANDING FINALS

- 1. Entry fee of \$60 per person.
- 2. \$500 will be added to the total purse by EISF.
- 3. Teams consist of four riders/four head of cattle, with an 8-minute time limit.
- 4. An individual may compete twice at this event.
- 5. This event will be held under the EITPBA rules.

IDAHO STATE PRO AM TEAM BRANDING

- 1. Entry fee is \$45 per person.
- 2. Teams must consist of four riders. Two riders must be pros and two riders must be either two women or two children age 16 and under or one of each.
- 3. Women and children may enter twice, pros may enter once.
- 4. There will be a 5-minute time limit. 2 head of cattle.
- 5. Teams will be required to qualify from a county show as in the open.
- 6. This event will be held under the EISF rules.

DEPARTMENT B – LIGHT HORSES PERFORMANCE & HALTER CLASSES BECKY JACOBSON - SUPERINTENDENT

Awards will be made according to the merits of the exhibit. If no competition exists or if an article is not worthy of 1st premium, the judge may disqualify or award 2nd, 3rd or 4th premiums at his or her discretion. Only one of each placing in any one class will be

awarded unless otherwise specified. Where no competition exists but the judge deems the animal or item worthy of a blue ribbon it can be considered for Grand Champion.

ENTRY FEES:

Quarter Horse: \$18.00 per class Appaloosa: \$15.00 per class Paints: \$15.00 per class Arabians: \$18.00 per class All Others: \$10.00 per class Children, Pony and Walk Trot: No Entry Fee/No Premium Pd/ No Exhibitor Pass

ENTRIES: AUGUST 16.

- A. Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 1 animal entered. Tickets are non-transferable.
- B. Payment for exhibitor tickets must accompany entry.
- A. Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 1 animal entered. Tickets are non-transferable.
- B. Payment for exhibitor tickets must accompany entry.

STALLS:

- a. A \$15.00 stall fee per horse will be charged. Stall requests will not be taken before August 1. Anyone wishing to stall throughout the week should make their request at that time and MUST stay through Saturday. No stalls will be provided unless an animal is entered and shown in a Light Horse/Horse Show class. Animals stalled must be shown. All stall requests should be sent to beckys1trickpony@gmail.com.
- 4-H stalling is for August 31 ONLY. Open class horses cannot come in until Sunday after 1:00 p.m. PLEASE CHECK WITH LIVESTOCK OFFICE BEFORE PLACING HORSE IN STALLS.

ENTRY FORMS:

- A. Horses to be entered under the OWNER'S name and should be the same name that appears on the horse's registration papers.
- B. Entry forms must be complete and legible copies of the horse's registration papers front and back must accompany the entry.
- C. You must also include a copy of the front and back of your current membership card. Group classes to be entered and shown under Sire or Dam's name and registration number respectively.
- D. All entry forms must be completed, signed, with attached copies of registration papers and CURRENT membership cards and fees paid before 5:00 p.m. on the day prior to the show or entry will be scratched from the class. ("No class changes will be made after 5:00 pm the day prior to the show.")
- E. Ages must be computed from January 1st.
- F. Incomplete entry forms will not be entered.
- G. Any youth entries must include the youths name, address and birth date.

- A. Each exhibitor may purchase one Livestock Exhibitor Ticket for \$20.00 for a full week or \$10.00 for a half week. Caretakers may also purchase exhibitors tickets, but no more than one ticket for each 1 animal entered. Tickets are non-transferable.
- B. Payment for exhibitor tickets must accompany entry.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- A. PREMIUMS PAID TO OWNER OF ANIMAL EXCEPT IN THE CHILDREN'S PONY CLASS.
- Each exhibitor is responsible for providing all necessary information for show reports to the Livestock Office before their class begins. Management will not be responsible for animals not reported due to lack of information.
- C. Exhibitor will inspect stall before stalling the horse. Report any stalling problem before stalling animal. Stalls must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the Superintendent may direct.
- D. All entries MUST upon request provide a receipt or invoice proving that their horse was vaccinated against Equine Herpes Virus 1 and Equine Influenza within the previous 6 months of the event
- E. All horses MUST have their temperature taken twice a day beginning 3 days prior to entering the fairgrounds. Horses with elevated temperatures of 101.5 degrees or greater should consult a veterinarian before bringing the horse to the fair for any competition.
