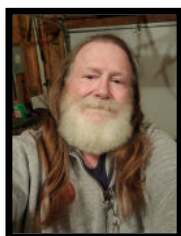

**\*Early Entry Exhibitors who submit Entry Forms by Monday, August 11, 2025, to the Eastern Idaho State Fair will have the option of their tags being mailed out for a \$3.00 additional processing fee (to cover postage and handling).**

**\*Each individual exhibitor must be present during entering.**

**ENTRY FEE:** \$1.00 each for the first 4 items or \$5.00 per page (**see below for restrictions**).

- **Maximum of 72 items or less per exhibitor**, Entry Forms **MUST** be received **by** August 19, 2025, exhibitor must be present during item entering.
- **Maximum of 36 items or less per exhibitor** for any Entry Form received **after** August 19, 2025, exhibitor must be present during item entering.

**ENTRY FORMS and TAGS:** Entry Form(s) submitted to [entries@funatthefair.com](mailto:entries@funatthefair.com) or sent/delivered to the Eastern Idaho State Fair - Main Office, PO Box 250, Blackfoot, ID 83221 and **RECEIVED** by EISF Office **by Tuesday, August 19, 2025, may enter up to 72 items**. The tags will be laser printed and be available on date of entry for attachment to all Antique Department entries.

**PLEASE NOTE:** *If Antique Entry Forms are received by Monday, August 11, 2025, to the Eastern Idaho State Fair Main Office, we will print the Entry Tags and have them ready for pick up by Thursday, August 14, 2025, OR Entry Tags can be mailed for an additional fee of \$3.00 per exhibitors.*

**ENTRY DATES (for all items):** *No exhibits will be received prior to or after the hours listed below.*

- Friday, August 22, 2025, from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- Saturday, August 23, 2025, from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

**ENTRY FORMS:**

- 72 ITEMS OR LESS, ENTRY FORMS DUE BY AUGUST 19, 2025.

Entries will still be accepted and received on August 22<sup>nd</sup> and August 23<sup>rd</sup> even if entry forms were not pre-entered before these dates. Items will be a maximum of 36 items, and you will need to wait to have tags entered and printed.

**ENTRY LOCATION:** Antiques Building which is west of the EISF Main Gate – No. 1.

- Enter thru Service Gate - No. 2
- SINGLE LANE PARKING ON SOUTH SIDE OF ROADWAY IN FRONT OF ANTIQUE BUILDING.
- NO BLOCKING ROADWAY or PARKING ON GRASS IN FRONT OF ANTIQUES BUILDING OR ON BLUE RIBBON BOULEVARD.
- NO EMPLOYEE PARKING ON FAIRGROUNDS, please park on Park Street.

**CASH PREMIUMS:** will be available at Park Street-Payout Window, west of Main Gate No. 1.

- After September 9, 2025, awards will be given out only during regular office hours and may be picked up at the E.I.S.F. Main Office, hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with lunch from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. E.I.S.F. Main Office will also be closed on Friday, September 12, 2025, at 3:00 p.m. and will be closed on Monday, September 15, 2025, all day to observe the Labor Day Holiday for office employees. **Premiums not claimed by September 29, 2025, will be considered a donation, and will revert to the EISF General Fund.**

**RELEASE DATE:**

- Sunday, September 7, 2025, from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. (NO EXCEPTIONS)
- The fair will not be responsible for articles left after 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 7, 2025. There will be a Storage Fee on ALL entries left after the 3rd week of September. The charge will be \$20 per week. All entries not picked up will be disposed of 30 days after completion of Fair.

**SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:**

- Antiques must be 70 years old or older, unless specified in division headings.
- Exhibits will be entered in the appropriate division and class ONLY.
- Each individual exhibitor must be present during entering unless written approval from the Superintendent is received prior to entry dates.
- NO ITEM LARGER THAN 2' X 3' FLOOR SPACE ACCEPTED.
- Only department personnel will be allowed inside the railing.
- Security will be on duty during entry and throughout the week of the fair.
- Dishes **MUST** be washed, and other articles cleaned. Other small items must be in small boxes and secured.
- No damaged or chipped articles will be accepted. EXCEPTIONS AT SUPERINTENDENTS' DISCRETION.
- THE CHAMPION AWARD AND SUPERINTENDENT AWARD ITEMS CANNOT BE RE-ENTERED OR RECEIVE A RIBBON FOR 10 YEARS.
- THE GRAND CHAMPION ITEM CANNOT BE RE-ENTERED OR RECEIVE A RIBBON FOR 15 YEARS.
- Collections will consist of 6 (six) items only, SOME EXCEPTIONS MAY APPLY. Items must be of the same function, not matching and well displayed.

- L. The Eastern Idaho Fair District will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of exhibits entered. However, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting the articles. In no case will the Eastern Idaho Fair District be responsible in any way for loss or damage to articles submitted.
- M. **EXHIBITORS MUST IN ALL CASES BE THE BONA FIDE OWNERS OF ARTICLES EXHIBITED BY THEM. THE PERSON ENTERING THE ARTICLES FOR EXHIBIT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THEM, AND MUST BE THE PERSON WHO PICKS THEM UP. PLEASE DO NOT ENTER FAMILY HEIRLOOMS.** In no case will the Eastern Idaho Fair District be responsible in any way for loss or damage to articles submitted.
- N. Presentation of article to be entered and submission of entry form shall be deemed acceptance of this rule.
- O. Judging will be based upon the following criteria: age, condition, rarity, overall appearance, and cleanliness. Acceptance of items for judging will be at the discretion of the judges, and/or superintendents.
- P. TWO EXHIBITS ENTERED BY THE SAME PERSON OR HOUSEHOLD DOES NOT CONSTITUTE COMPETITION IN THE SAME CATEGORY AND/OR DIVISION AND WILL NOT BE JUDGED.
- Q. No entry will be accepted unless a category for it is listed in the Exhibitor Handbook.
- R. NO PREMIUM WILL BE PAID IF NO COMPETITION EXISTS – A COMPETITION CONSISTS OF A MINIMUM OF THREE (3) OR MORE ENTRIES IN A SINGLE DEPARTMENT CLASS.
- S. Superintendents have the right to move an entry into a different class if the original entered class will not have enough entries for a competition to exist.
- T. Superintendents will be the only persons authorized to change class entries.
- U. Awards will be made according to the merits of the entry. If the judge decides an entry is not worthy of 1<sup>st</sup> place, the judge may disqualify the entry or the judge can choose to award 2<sup>nd</sup> place, or 3<sup>rd</sup> place premiums, this is at the judge's discretion. If there is no competition for an entry, but the judge still deems that the entry would have been worthy of a blue ribbon it can still be considered for any Department Special Awards.
- V. Only one of each placing in any one class will be awarded, unless otherwise specified in Department Special Rules.
- W. **No one is allowed behind the fence in exhibit areas.**
