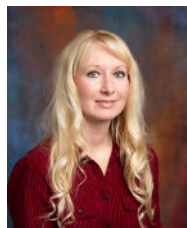

REMINDERS FOR 2026

- * **NO TRAILER PARKING IN THE P4-GODDARD LOT. LOAD AND UNLOAD ONLY.**
- * **ALL LIVESTOCK/HORSES MUST REMAIN IN THE BARN UNTIL RELEASE TIMES.**
- * **NO BLUE OR COLORED TARPS MAY BE HUNG ON OR IN BARN.**
- * **BARN AREA, INCLUDING GROOMING CHUTE AREA, MUST BE CLEAN AND NEAT AT ALL TIMES.**
- * **NO ONE IS ALLOWED TO STAY OVERNIGHT IN BARN, even in the Grooming Chute Area.**
- * **NO DOGS or OTHER ANIMALS THAT ARE NOT ENTRIES AT THE FAIR ARE ALLOWED ON EISF PROPERTY, except Fully Trained Service Animals.** (full information available on EISF Website or <https://www.ADA.gov>)
- * **NO DOGS OR ANY OTHER ANIMALS ARE ALLOWED IN LIVESTOCK BARN, including Service Animals, per ADA Guidelines.** (full information available on EISF Website or <https://www.ADA.gov>)

ENTRY FEE: \$10.00 per animal

- *Required for both mares and colts; Youth Classes no fee in either division.*

LATE FEE: A late fee of \$10.00 will be charged, upon approval of Superintendent, on entries made after August 21, 2026, through September 4, 2026.

- **BOOKS WILL BE CLOSED AND ABSOLUTELY NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE AFTER:**
 - **Miniature Horses at 6:00 p.m. on FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2026**
 - **Ponies at 6:00 p.m. on TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 2026**
 - **This rule will be strictly enforced by the Superintendents.**

Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no exhibitor will be allowed to receive more than two (2) premiums in any one class.

PASSES:

- \$25.00 Exhibitor full week pass (1 pass allowed per exhibitor)
- \$15.00 Exhibitor ½ week pass (2 passes allowed per exhibitor)
 - Caretakers may also purchase exhibitor tickets, but no more than one (1) ticket will be allowed for each three (3) animals entered.

- Ponies on grounds Wednesday, September 9, 2026, by 10:00 a.m. and released from grounds on Saturday, September 12, 2026, at 6:00 p.m.

STALLS:

- **Requested stalls must be filled. Due to space limitations, we are unable to honor one day stall requests.**
- The Superintendent(s) will assign stalls. ALL STALLED ANIMALS MUST BE SHOWN.
- **Miniature horses and ponies will ALL be stalled in the Goddard Pavilion.**
- **No exceptions are allowed.**
- Stall request is on the Entry Form, no charge for stalls, maximum of 5 stalls per exhibitor.
- Initial bedding of wood shavings will be provided by EISF for each division on entry date.
- All stalled animals must stay for the entire ½ week of their specific division.
- Stalls must be cleaned by 9:00 a.m. each day and refuse disposed of as the Superintendent directs.
- If you are checking-out Tuesday, September 8th you must clean your stall out prior to leaving fairgrounds.
- The Superintendent will determine the assigned time each day that she/he will be available for exhibitors to obtain new shavings.

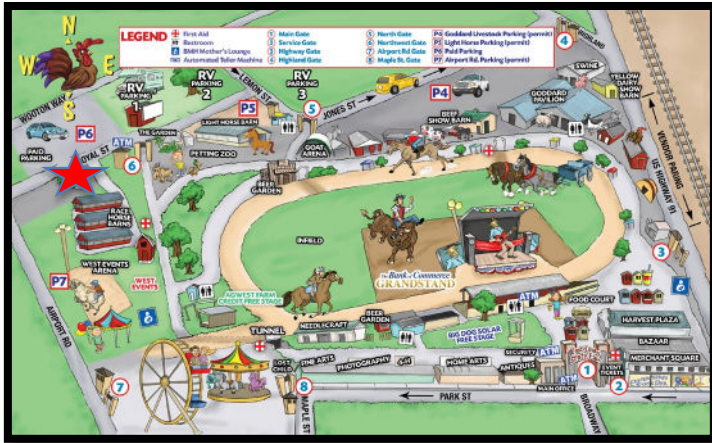
SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES: **PLEASE BE AWARE OF AND FOLLOW ALL THE RULES.**

- AGGRESSIVE ANIMALS ARE NOT ALLOWED. The Eastern Idaho State Fair reserves the right to remove any animal that is unruly, aggressive, or causing stress to other animals or fairgoers. NO walkways will be blocked off by any exhibitor. If an animal needs to be fenced off from people passing by, then the animal must be removed from the fairgrounds.**
- Youth and COOL participants are not allowed to show a stallion(s) in any class.**
- Ages must be calculated using January 1st.
- All participants, including those hauling in, must check in with the superintendents prior to the beginning showtime each day. Check-in times are listed in the class lists.
- Miniature horses and ponies will be measured at a natural stance prior to classes or the current year's height cards can be provided. Miniature horse height is 34" and under and over 34" up to 38". Pony height is over 38" and less than 58".
- You are responsible for ensuring your entry form information and class entries are correct **the day before** the show. Accommodation for incorrect entries that are not a result of fair staff errors may be excused from showing at the discretion of the superintendents.
- Reasonable efforts are made to help participants get to the gate for each class. A **three-minute** gate hold will be announced if a participant is not at the gate. If a participant does not appear at the gate within three minutes, the class will be closed, and the participant will forfeit the class.
- Additional time for tack changes during the driving classes may be given at the discretion of the superintendents. Allotted time will not exceed 15 minutes.
- The only ribbons that may be displayed are those won at the 2026 Eastern Idaho State Fair.
- Rosettes will be awarded for 1st place through 6th place in Performance Classes. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st place through 6th place in Halter Classes. Rosettes will be awarded to Champion, Reserve Champion, and Overall Supreme.
- Judge may allow points for personal appearance of exhibitor. Exhibitors should have a clean and neat appearance when showing animals.

- L. Closed-toe shoes must be worn in the show ring. Exhibitors with open-toed shoes may be dismissed at the judge's discretion.
- M. Classes may be changed at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- N. Entry forms must list the name and birthdate of each animal entered.
- O. An animal cannot be entered in more than one (1) division.
- P. Exhibitors must have the correct entry number with them in the show arena.
- Q. **NO** schooling of animals at ringside or in any alleys. Warm up area is located outside at the east end of the Goddard Pavilion.
- R. Good sportsmanship and ethical behavior are always required. All fair staff, including department superintendents, judges, and other exhibitors must be treated with respect. Failure to observe this rule is grounds for dismissal for the next two years in all EISF competitions.
- S. Use of performance altering drugs on miniature horses or ponies is strictly prohibited.
- T. See "ATV POLICY" in EISF 2026 General Rules for permit and fees. (NO ATV's ON FAIRGROUNDS WITHOUT PAID PERMIT)
- U. COOL Class Rules:
 - a. **A minimum of one guardian per participant must be PRESENT for each COOL class participant.**
 - b. **Guardian name and contact information must be provided to the Superintendents before September 2, 2026.**
 - c. The guardian must be willing and able to assist the participant before, during, and after classes. **The COOL classes listed must be adhered to. Additional classes will not be added. There is absolutely no exception to this rule.**
 - d. No entries will be accepted after September 2, 2026 in COOL classes.
 - e. EISF Management and EMS Supervisor must be notified by September 2, 2026 of any participants in any COOL classes.
 - f. The guardian must inform the department superintendent and/or assistant superintendent of any existing medical conditions and treatment for conditions of COOL participants.
 - g. The guardian must be onsite to provide any potential necessary care or emergency services for COOL class participants.
 - h. The department superintendent(s) and/or the EISF Management should be made aware of any ambulatory requirements and other assistance required a minimum of five days prior to showing events.
 - i. The department superintendent(s) and/or the EISF Management must be informed of any fused joints, severe joint limitations, seizure disorders and other conditions that warrant additional assistance from fair management.
 - j. COOL class participants may not show without meeting the above requirements.
- V. ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS: See "EASTERN IDAHO STATE FAIR 2026 GENERAL RULES"
- W. If a question(s) arises that is not covered by these rules, the American Shetland Pony Club Rules will be followed.

HEALTH POLICY:

- A. All out-of-state horse entries must be accompanied by a current (within 30 days of EISF) health certificate and a negative Coggin's test within the last 6 months. A copy of the current health certificate must be provided to the Livestock Office upon entering the fairgrounds.
 - Any livestock (equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae) entering Idaho from a premises where vesicular stomatitis (VS) has been diagnosed within the last 30 days shall be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection dated within 14 days of entry containing the following statement: "All animals identified on this certificate of veterinary inspection have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the last 30 days, these animals have not been exposed to VS or located within an area where VS has been diagnosed."
- B. Vaccinate all horses coming to the EISF against the Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino). A 2-way vaccine is available that is inexpensive and effective. Pneumabort K is one example that has proven to help prevent the neurological form of this disease. The vaccine does not provide 100% immunity but will provide a degree of protection from the virus.
- C. Due to the risk of spreading equine-related diseases, the temperature of all horses **MUST** be taken twice (2) daily beginning three (3) days prior to entering the fairgrounds. If a horse has an elevated temperature of 101.5 degrees or greater, a veterinarian should be contacted before bringing the horse to the EISF.
