- PROFESSIONAL: \$1.00 each for the first 4 entries or \$5.00 per sheet

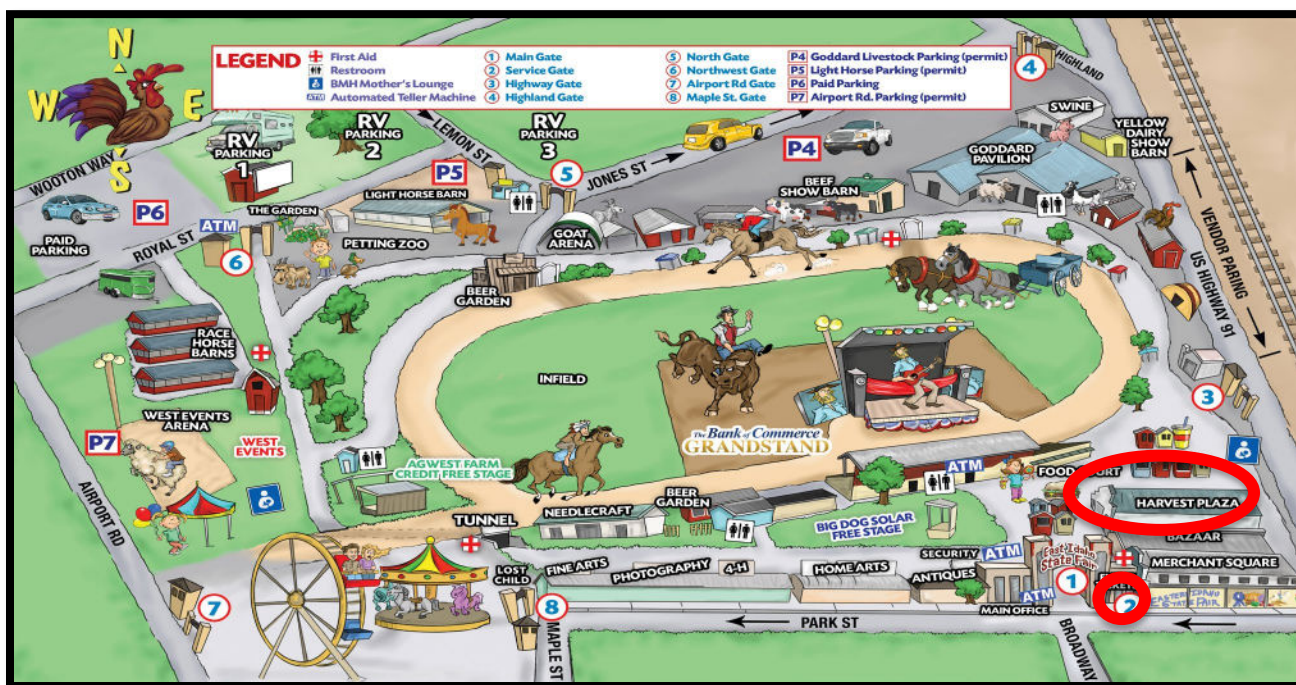
ENTRY FORM/TAGS:

- Entry Forms are available online and/or will be available at time of entering.
- There will NOT be any entry tags given out prior to entry day, without superintendent permission.

ENTRY LOCATION:

- EISF Harvest Plaza-Building No. 8, north commercial building closest to the grandstand – enter through south door, please park on the street, do not pull into the fairgrounds.
- Wagons will be available on a first come first served basis, wagons will be located at Gate No. 2.

RELEASE DATE:

- Sunday, September 13, 2026, from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. Items not picked up will be disposed of.

CASH PREMIUMS: will be available at Park Street-Payout Window, west of Main Gate No. 1.

- Monday, September 7 through Saturday, September 12, 2026, from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm
- Sunday, September 13, 2026, from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm
- Monday, September 14, 2026, from 8:30 am to 7:00 pm *at the Photography Dept. Bldg.*
- After September 14, 2026, awards will be given out only during regular office hours and may be picked up at the EISF Main Office, hours are 8:30 am to 4:30 pm with lunch from 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm EISF Main Office will also be closed on Friday, September 18, 2026, at 3:00 pm and will be closed on Monday, September 20, 2026, all day to observe the Labor Day Holiday for office employees. **Premiums not claimed by September 29, 2026, will be considered a donation, and will revert to the EISF General Fund.**

SPECIAL DEPARTMENT RULES:

- Flowers will be judged on quality of blossom, foliage, arrangement, and stem. **NO ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS WILL BE ALLOWED.** Only flowers from the home garden are eligible.
- Only one entry accepted in each class from any one exhibitor. Only one flower specimen can be entered in any one class. Any duplicate entries will be disqualified. If a category is listed for a flower (i.e. rosemallow) it can only be entered in that specific category and cannot be entered in the "other" category. The "other" category is only for those entries that do not belong in any other listed category. *For example, if you have an*

extra petunia bouquet you can't enter it in the "other" category. It will be disqualified. If you do not know the name of a specimen you are entering, ask a department worker before entering it in an "Other" category.

When using your own containers, be sure to place a colored sticker (provided) on the front of entry tag. A limited number of containers are available for your use.

- C. IF ENTERING A NAMED ROSE, SUNFLOWER, OR OTHER SPECIFIC FLOWER VARIETY, PLEASE SPECIFY NAME ON BACK OF ENTRY TAG. If entering a flower variety not listed, specify the name on the entry tag.
- D. CLASS NAMES will be modified at the discretion of the Superintendent during entering, to accommodate class combinations and new plant types.
- E. The Supervisor shall have the right to remove, at any time, any exhibits or part of exhibit thereof which are unsightly.
- F. Exhibitors are urged to refresh their exhibits with fresh flowers anytime they come to attend the fair. In addition, flowers exhibitors will be allowed to sign IN and OUT of the Fair free of gate admission through the main office for 1 (one) hour on Tuesday, September 2, anytime between the hours of 10:00 am and 7:00 pm in order to refresh their exhibits.
- G. **TWO EXHIBITS ENTERED BY THE SAME PERSON OR HOUSEHOLD *(Except Junior Division, where siblings can enter same classes) DOES NOT CONSTITUTE COMPETITION IN THE SAME CLASS and WILL NOT BE JUDGED.**
- H. **No premium will be paid if no competition exists - a competition consists of a minimum of three (3) or more entries in a single department class.**
- I. Superintendent has the right to move an entry into a different class if the original entered class will not have enough entries for a competition to exist.
- J. Superintendent will be the only person authorized to change class entries.
- K. Awards will be made according to the merits of the entry. If the judge decides an entry is not worthy of 1st place, the judge may disqualify the entry or the judge can choose to award 2nd place, or 3rd place, this is at the judge's discretion.
- L. If there is no competition for an entry, but the judge still deems that the entry would have been worthy of a ribbon. It can still be considered for Department Special Awards.
- M. Only one of each placing in any one class will be awarded, unless otherwise specified in Department Special Rules.
- N. ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS: See "EASTERN IDAHO STATE FAIR 2026 GENERAL RULES".
